Emergency Response to Drought Affected Populations in Wajir County, Kenya(ERDAP)

- Start date: May 1st 2023
- End date: April 30th 2024
- Funded by: Bureau for humanitarian Assistance (BHA)
- It's a multispectral programme with the following sectors:
 - Multi-purpose cash assistance
 - WaSH
 - Agriculture

Budget is USD 3,000,000

MULTIPURPOSE CASH ASSISTANCE (MPCA)

-
- 5,140 drought affected households benefitted
 - Wajir West 570
 - Wajir North 775
 - Eldas 740
 - Wajir South 3,055
 - Payment was done for 6 months
 - Each household received Kshs 8,190 per month
 - Last payment was March 2024
 - Cash transferred (WS 150,122,700, WN 38,083,500, WW28,009,800, ED 36,363,600)

WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WaSH)

Achievements:

- Purchase and installation of 3 Gensets
- Installation of elevated steel tower tank of 50,000 litres and reticulation system of 1 km
- Construction of steel towers and installation of 10,000 litres tanks in 7 boreholes
- Rehabilitation of 13 animal troughs in 6 boreholes
- Reticulation system and repair work of the leaking pipelines in 7 boreholes
- Solarisation of 3 boreholes

- Water quality testing in all the boreholes to find suitability for human consumption
 - Water trucking in (Fatuma nur, Darisalam, Welahir, Shanta-Abaq, Tabarak and Tafakur) in Wajir West. (Yaqa, El-yunis, and horate) in Eldas, (Burder, Sukela, Machesa, Warabalcad and Laladha) in Wajir South.
 - Conatruction of water drawing points in 8 boreholes

- Rehabilitation 6 masonry tanks
 - Procurement and distribution of hygiene kits for 400 adult school going girls.
 - Hygiene education in all the WASH sites (13 sites)
 - Training of water management committees

Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance to Drought Affected Communities in Wajir county

- Start Date: November 1ST 2023
- End Date: May 31st 2024
- Duration: 7 Months
- Donar: Stabilization fund through IOM
- Project Budget KES 9,911,160
- Project Location: Wajir East and Wajir West

- 926 households were targeted for 3 months
 - Wajir West 726
 - Wajir East 200
 - Paid Kes 8,440 per month
 - Cash transferred (WW 18,382,320, WE 5,064,000) 23,446,320

Girls Improving Resilience through livelihood and health.

- Start Date: March 1ST 2024
- End Date: October 31st 2024
- Duration: 8 Months
- Donar: USAID through Mercy corps
- Project Budget KES 6,400,000
- Project Location: Wajir county (6 sub-counties)

- Mapping and registration of saving groups.
 - Saving groups physical linkages to field agents
 - Training of field agents on financial literacy

Emergency Response to drought affected women, men, girls and boys through MPCA, WaSH, Protection and Gender mainstreaming

- Start Date: May 15th 2023
- End Date: November 14th 2024
- Duration: 6 Months
- Donar: SIDA through OXFAM
- Project Budget KES 24,448,435
- Project Location: Wajir North

- The project had two sectors
 - WaSH and
 - Protection and Gender

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WaSH)

- We have constructed flood proof genset housings for 2 boreholes
- Repaired 3 Gensets affected by floods
- Extended water to two villages (Fanabua and Ido-roble) by installing 10,000 litres water tank with metal stand in each village complete with reticulation system of 1030 metres
- We have also installed 10,000 litres water tank with metal stand and reticulation system of 260 metres at Buna hospital

-
- We have trained 10 borehole management committees in Buna
 - WASDA conducted joint monitoring with the county government to oversee the work and do community handing over.
 - WASDA has facilitated two coordination meetings to review the existing water governance models and establish the road map to improving the adoption of models that work

PROTECTION AND GENDER

- We have trained 650 participants (girls, boys, men and women) on gender and protection issues.
- We have facilitated medical, legal and psychosocial support and cash to 80 at-risk persons within the project location.
- We have Convened two consultative multi-stakeholder co-ordination sessions targeting Gender Technical Working Group, National Police Service, and health referral actors to review existing co-ordination frameworks.

- We have done 3 sessions training 240 leaders (chiefs, elders, religious leaders) on Gender Based Violence prevention and alternative FGM rites of passage for strengthened GBV community based protection.
 - We have conducted training to strengthen the capacity of GBV health actors and Law enforcement to prevent, respond and mitigate GBV risks offering dignified and timely response.
 - We have conduct 10 Radio talk shows in vernacular to create gender and protection awareness in the local community
 - We have conducted 5 community dialogue meetings to sensitize the community on its gender and protection aspects

- This was multipurpose cash assistance for 3 months, target HH 1,183 drought affected
 - Wajir North target household 155
 - Wajir South 1,028
 - They received 3 cycles (3 months) at KES 8190
 - Total money transferred (WS 25,257,960, WN3,808,350) 29,066,310

- Project Budget KES 17,949,739
- Project Location: Wajir South and Wajir North

- This was multipurpose cash assistance for 1 months, target HH 654 flood affected
 - Wajir North target household 350
 - Wajir South 302
 - They received 1 cycles at KES 8190
 - Total money transferred (WS 2,489,760, WN2,866,500) 5,356,260

Food security and nutrition enhancement project for small scale farmers in Wajir county, Kenya

- Start Date: October 2023
- End Date: December 2023
- Duration: 3 Months
- Donar: Johanniter International
- Project Budget Eur 47,550
- Project Location: Wajir East and Wajir South

-
- This was 3 months project that targeted 20 farmers in Shaletay, Bulla maow, Hodhan and Qumbi. We have done the following:
 - Solarisation 20 shallow wells
 - Provision of seeds (capsicum, spinach, Sukuma, pawpaw, onions, tomato, Dania and water melon)
 - 5,000 litres plastic water tank
 - Towers to support the tank
 - Training of farmers on smart climate and conservation









Challenges

- **Political interference by the county government**
- **Community contractors**
- **Lack of patriotism and ownership**
- **Dwindling resources – funding**
- **Mushrooming settlements specially Wajir south causing thinly spread of resources**
- **Vastness of Wajir south increasing logistical costs**
- **Short term funding cycle which is mostly emergency**
